Program Description Start your career as an investigator! This program is the minimum level of training required to work in private investigations. Upon successful completion of this program, you will be eligible to apply for your investigator's licence through the Queensland Office of Fair Trading, and help secure employment in areas such as insurance fraud, corporate investigations or the government investigative sector (except Police).

Entry Requirements Minimum Education Level: Year 10 or Equivalent

Mature Age Entry (18 years of age and over) If you do not meet the standard entry requirements but your age and experience indicate a reasonable chance of success in a program, you may be offered a place.
